THOUGHT FOR THE DAY It's funny when we come across the source of an often cited quotation. We say to ourselves, 'oh, so that's where it comes from!' The saying 'you do not know the day or the hour' is one such saying, and comes from the parable of the wise and foolish virgins today.

This parable of the 5 wise and 5 foolish virgins, is, in fact, among the last of Jesus and when we look at the context of the Gospel Jesus is preaching towards the end of His own life.

We are all frightened by the shortness of life and our own mortality. When we are shaken by death we often see things with a renewed sense of gratitude that we can get up in the morning despite all our whinges at the demands and inconveniences that are made of us. Our worries are short-lived but we give thanks for what we have here and now. There is much symbolism in the parable. The oil in the lamp is the fuel needed to provide the light in the darkness, to guide the way, which the foolish virgins lack. What is this oil? Wisdom and virtue, as the First Reading tells us. This means discernment of what the most important things in life are, as well as a consciousness of why we are here, in this time and space and what our duties are to God and neighbour. The oil points to the light we are called to be to others, as well as pointing to Christ the Light We cannot give what we do not possess ourselves. Jesus said on the Sermon on the Mount. 'You are the light of the world; no one places a lamp under a bed or a bushel, but where it will be seen. You must let your light (your deeds) be seen, so that others may give praise to your Father in heaven.' The Lord is coming for each of us, each in turn; it is only a matter of when. We 'do not know the day or the hour.' May Our Lady pray for us 'now and at the hour of our death.' But as we say in the Mass - 'we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.'

**Can I continue to pray and gain indulgences
for the Faithful Departed?**

While Level 5 restrictions do make an allowance for a visit to a grave during this time, the Church - and the parish clergy - are keenly aware of difficulties people face in observing the customs associated with this time of year especially Masses for the Holy Souls and offering public prayers in cemeteries. This year there will be no official public prayers in the cemeteries themselves but prayer will be offered online at 2 pm this Sunday from St Mary's for the Faithful Departed of Mallow and Mourneabbey parishes. You may wish to visit the graves of loved ones in our own time these Sundays or on All Souls Day.



The Vatican has recently published new guidelines that take into account the difficulties people are encountering in customarily visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead to gain the Indulgence from November 1st-8th. You may now offer your prayers **on any day of November** to gain the Plenary Indulgence applicable to the souls of the dead. If you are prevented from visiting a grave you can offer mental prayer and set prayers such as the Rosary or Divine Mercy chaplet of Morning or Evening Prayer of the Church from the Office of the Dead.

Confessions are available at the usual times in St Mary's on Saturdays and Church of the Resurrection on Fridays
