THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

Praying for the dead in this time of lockdown

Can I continue to pray and gain indulgences for the Faithful Departed?

While Level 5 restrictions do make an allowance for a visit to a grave during this time, the Church - and the parish clergy - are keenly aware of difficulties people face in observing the customs associated with this time of year especially Masses for the Holy Souls and offering public prayers in cemeteries. This year there will be no official public prayers in the cemeteries themselves but prayer will be offered online at 2 pm this Sunday from St Mary's for the Faithful Departed of Mallow and Mourneabbey parishes. You may wish to visit the graves of loved ones in our own time these Sundays or on All Souls Day.

The Vatican has recently published new guidelines that take into account the difficulties people are encountering in customarily visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead to gain the Indulgence from November 1st-8th.

You may now offer your prayers **on any day of November** to gain the Plenary Indulgence applicable to the souls of the dead. If you are prevented from visiting a grave you can offer mental prayer and set prayers such as the Rosary or Divine Mercy chaplet of Morning or Evening Prayer of the Church from the Office of the Dead. Confessions are available at the usual times in St Mary's on Saturdays and Church of the Resurrection on Fridays

Memorial Masses for the faithful departed of the parish in the last 12 months

There will be a **memorial Mass celebrated online at St Mary's on Friday November 13th at 7.30 pm** —remembering by name all those who have died in the last 12 months. -we will remember parishioners who died from October 2019 to January 2020.

In this month of November we remember to pray for our beloved dead. **Each of the priests of the parish celebrates 12 Masses for the Holy Souls.**



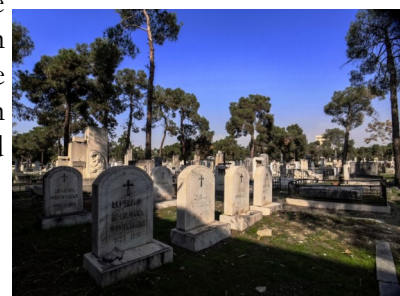
Envelopes with a form for including the names of your dear departed loved ones continue to be available at the back of both parish churches. We invite you to take away the envelope and form with you. Please return your filled in form and an offering in the sealed envelope to the parish. You may also wish to pass on an envelope to those who are sick and housebound who would wish to have their loved ones remembered and return the envelope on their behalf to the parish. You can drop your envelope into the Parish Office under the door of the office. Alternatively you can drop the envelope and offering into any of the priest's houses. The lists of all the deceased will be placed in front of the altar for the month of November.

A Novena of Masses for the faithful departed will be celebrated online in St Mary's Church at 7.30pm for 9 weekday evenings beginning on **Monday 2nd November which is All Souls Day and will continue until Thursday 12th November.**

Prayers will be offered **each Sunday in November** at 2pm for the faithful departed **online** for the deceased in each of the cemeteries in Mallow and Mourneabbey Parishes.
