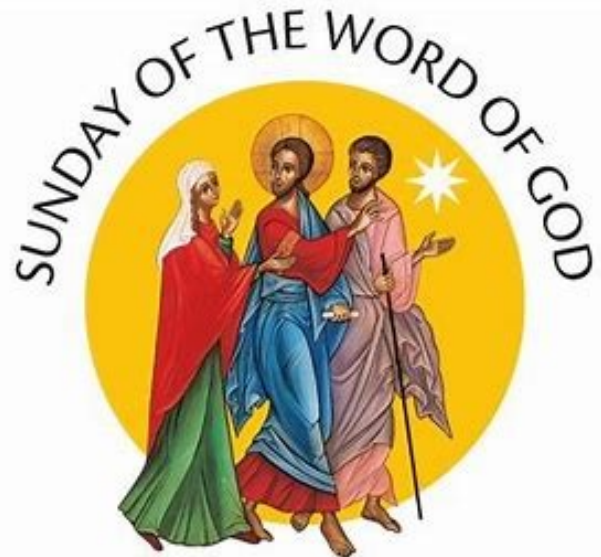

In September 2019 Pope Francis announced: "At the conclusion of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, I proposed setting aside "a Sunday given over entirely to the word of God, so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people" (Misericordia et Misera, 7). **I hereby declare that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the word of God.** This Sunday of the Word of God will thus be a fitting part of that time of the year when we are encouraged to strengthen our bonds with the Jewish people and to pray for Christian unity. This is more than a temporal coincidence: the celebration of the Sunday of the Word of God has ecumenical value, since the Scriptures point out, for those who listen, the path to authentic and firm unity."

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place this Sunday at St Mary's Church **online** at 7.30 pm to 8.30 pm **online only**. **Churches open daily for private prayer until at 6.00 pm.**

Collections

Now that we are in lockdown again people are asking: "where do I hand in my envelopes".

Your generosity to parish and diocesan collections as well as your support of your parish clergy during 2020, a very difficult year, is deeply appreciated. As we are in another lockdown your ongoing support in 2021 is needed.

Methods of Contributing:

1. On-line is a very safe and popular way of shopping being used by huge numbers of people who hardly heard of the facility this time last year. It is now possible to give your contributions to church collections on-line.

Log on to www.mallowparish.ie and click the DONATE button.

Click on; 1. Sunday Collection (recurring).

Filling in here the amount you wish to donate every Sunday (recurring), giving your Envelope Number, together with your personal and bank account details will mean that the specified amount will be automatically deducted from your bank account in favour of Mallow Catholic Parish account every week. All data is safely encrypted.

You will be notified every time money leaves your account.

If you choose this method it will eliminate all anxieties about handling cash and handing in envelopes. There is a separate section to be filled in for the different collections held in the parish during the year including the offerings to the priests.

2. A Standing Order with your bank is another method of contributing.
