Pope Francis' words after his Angelus Address on Sunday 13th March 2022

We have just prayed to the Virgin Mary. This weekend, the city that bears her name, Mariupol, has become a city martyred by the ruinous war that is devastating Ukraine. Faced with the barbarism of the killing of children, and of innocent and defenceless citizens, there are no strategic reasons that hold up: the only thing to be done is to cease the unacceptable armed aggression before the city is reduced to a cemetery. With an aching heart I add my voice to that of the common people, who implore the end of the war. In the name of God, listen to the cry of those who suffer, and put an end to the bombings and the attacks! Let there be real and decisive focus on the negotiations, and let the humanitarian corridors be effective and safe. In the name of God, I ask you: stop this massacre!

Excerpt of the statement after the Spring 2022 Meeting of the Irish Bishops

During the Season of Lent, we encourage everyone to return to Sunday and weekday Mass in our churches, welcoming each other back as we gather once more together. From Easter Sunday, 17th April, this will once again be deemed an essential expression of faith for all in our Church in Ireland. Statement by the Director of the Holy See Press Office, on March 15th, 2022

Friday 25th March during the Celebration of Penance which he will preside over at 5.p.m. (4pm Irish time) in St. Peter's Basilica, Pope Francis will consecrate to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Russia and Ukraine. The same act, on the same day, will be performed in Fatima by His Eminence Cardinal Krajewski, Almoner of His Holiness, as envoy of the Holy Father.
