## The Society of St Vincent de Paul—2022 Annual Appeal

The theme of our appeal this year is 'Food or Heating' as many families will face impossible choices this Christmas. People who would normally cope, are coming to SVP for help due to inflated high rents and fuel bills. Bonuses from the state have helped for specific needs.

When we do our visitations, we see a lot of hardship, especially where there are children and illnesses. That is where the SVP steps in, giving help at the right time to stop a family experiencing a prolonged hardship. Winter time is the most challenging. Last year we helped in the region of 360 families with food, food vouchers, oil, coal, gas vouchers and hampers to a cost of €55,000. We all know the cost of fuel and food at present and demands are greater this year and growing by the week. We estimate that our expenditure on fuel alone will double this winter.

Thank you to the parishioners who have given so generously to our weekly collections where the amount collected so far this year comes to €43K. Without this help we simply would not be able to support our fellow Parishioners on your behalf.

We would sincerely like to thank Monsignor Anthony O'Brien and his priests for their support and co-operation with St Vincent de Paul.

We would also like to thank all our workers, auxiliary members, collectors and donors whose generosity has helped make our work possible throughout the year.
