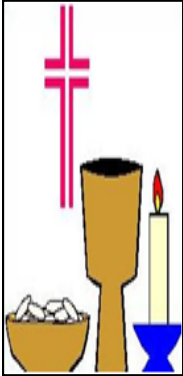

*Excerpt from a message from Bishop Paul Dempsey of Achroyn, Chair of the Irish Episcopal Council for Emigrants.*

As a Church and a people, we must continue to reach out to those who are affected by emigration. Since 1957, the Irish Episcopal Council for Emigrants (IECE) has been responding to the needs of Irish emigrants around the world.
