THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST

In these weeks the Gospel at Mass concerns the Holy Eucharist, The following is a summary of Christian teaching on the Holy Eucharist based on the Catechism of the Catholic Church. It will be printed over the next number of weeks.

In the 2^{nd} Chapter of the Acts of the Apostles, which recounts the life of the Church in the time after the Death and Resurrection of the Lord, we read the following:

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers...Day by day, attending the Temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they partook of food with glad and generous hearts.

In a very short space of time, the consumption of food and in particular the 'breaking of bread', is mentioned twice as an integral part of Christian discipleship. It is understandable that an account of Christian life would include things like prayer and being attentive to the testimony of the apostles, who had known the Lord intimately. So why the detail about eating food?

These are the first references to the celebration of the Eucharist after the Lord's Ascension and show that from the very beginning the Church has taken to heart the Lord's words at the Last Supper: 'Do this in memory of me.'

Centuries have passed since these first gatherings of Christians at the Eucharistic Table and since then the Church's understanding of what the Eucharist is and why it is so important has grown and deepened enormously. This understanding is very well expressed and summarised in the teaching from *Lumen Gentium* of the Second Vatican Council, that the Eucharist is the 'source and summit of the Christian life' and from *Presbyterorum Ordinis* that 'in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch.'

The difference in character between the description of the Eucharist in the Acts of the Apostles and that of the Second Vatican Council, and many councils before it, hardly needs to be pointed out. But what has led the Church to give the Eucharist such a high and central place in Her life comes from the mouth of the Lord himself in words spoken by him at Capernaum: 'I am the bread of life.' *Continued next Sunday*.
