THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST Continued

We know that the Lord is present to his Church in various ways: where two or three are gathered in his name, he is there among them; he is present in those who are in need; he is present in the celebration of the various sacraments; he is present in the person of the priest at Mass. But in the Eucharist, in the consecrated species of bread and wine, the Lord is present in a singular and especial way. The mode (manner) of the Lord's presence in the Eucharist is unique among the sacraments. When material elements are used in Baptism, Confirmation, the Anointing of the Sick and Ordination, those elements are not said to be Christ. When they are used in conjunction with certain words then God is truly acting by means of them. But we do not say that the water used in Baptism is Christ; that the Chrism at Confirmation is Christ; that the Oil of the Sick is Christ etc. We do say that the Eucharist is the real and living Christ; that contained in It are his body, blood, soul and divinity and that this remains so once the celebration of the Mass has ended and until the Eucharistic elements can no longer be said to be bread/wine in a material sense. Because the bread and wine are the signs that point to the deeper reality of Christ's presence, once they cease to be effective signs the reality also ceases. The Church has always held to this truth of the Real Presence, and it is found very strongly in the writings of the Church Fathers. St Ambrose goes as far as to point out that if God was able to create all that there is from nothing, then it cannot be impossible for Christ to make of something that which it was not before i.e. to make his body of bread and his blood of wine.
