#### THE SEASON OF ADVENT

While our civil year begins on 1<sup>st</sup> January, the Church's year begins on the First Sunday of Advent. It is the first stage of our yearly commemoration of the Lord's life in what we call the Church's *temporal cycle*. From the First Sunday of Advent each year until the Saturday after the Feast of Christ the King we recall the mysteries of the Lord's life, death and resurrection and peppered among that commemoration is the *sanctoral cycle* i.e. the feast days of the saints and martyrs whose lives and, at times, deaths stood as a witness to the love of God in the world.

Advent is a time of preparation for celebrating the birth of Christ and for recalling that he will come again at the end of time. It is a penitential time and so the colour violet (purple) is used in the Liturgy and flowers are removed from the church. The Advent wreath, which has become a staple part of marking the Advent season in the last 30 years or so, marks off the four Sundays of this short season, the circle of evergreen leaves being a reminder of the eternity of God himself who has neither beginning nor end.

#### **3 DECEMBER – ST FRANCIS XAVIER, PRIEST**

**S** T FRANCIS XAVIER He was born in the Basque country of Spain in 1506. He met Ignatius Loyola when he was a student in Paris, and he was ordained priest in 1537. In 1541 the Pope sent him as

part of a mission to India, and he spent the rest of his life in the East, preaching the Gospel in Goa and Malacca. He made many converts and fought against the exploitation of the native population by the Europeans. He spent two years on a successful mission to Japan, laying the foundations of many Christian communities; and in 1552, after entering China secretly to preach the Gospel there, he died of fever and exhaustion on the Chinese island of Shangchwan.
