PREPARING FOR LENT

Lent Begins the week after next, on 5th March. As we know, Lent is a time of penance and reconciliation with God in preparation for the celebration of Easter, the greatest feast of the Christian calendar. In days gone by Lent was still a time of serious fasting and abstinence with each bishop setting down fasting regulations for his diocese. After the Second Vatican Council these official regulations gradually disappeared and aside from Ash Wednesday & Good Friday people were left to decide their Lenten penances for themselves, as it was felt that genuine penance should be from the heart rather than the slavish adherence to rules. Strangely, this makes things more difficult for us as we have to come up with our own ways of marking Lent and making it a time that genuinely brings us closer to God through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. This may involve giving some things up for the season and taking other things on. Either way, may each of us begin Lent with a clear and realistic plan of the things we will do, be they extra fasting (as opposed to dieting!), attending daily Mass or resolving to spend more time each day at prayer e.g. the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet, Stations of the Cross, meditative prayer or other prayers or reading the Scriptures. 'Feeling' Lent as a time that is marked by prayer and self-denial makes the joy and celebration of Easter all the more meaningful.

23 FEBRUARY - ST POLYCARP, BISHOP & MARTYR

T POLYCARP was a disciple of the Apostles, bishop of Smyrna, and a friend of St Ignatius of Antioch. He went to Rome to confer with Pope Anicetus about the celebration of Easter. He was martyred in about 155 by being burnt to death in the stadium. Polycarp is an important figure in the history of the Church because he is one of the earliest Christians whose writings still survive. He bears witness to the beliefs of the early Christians and the early stages of the development of doctrine.
